

## Matrix and word sums for <do> and <go>

do ing es ne

do + ing  $\rightarrow$  doinggo + ing  $\rightarrow$  goingdo + es  $\rightarrow$  doesgo + es  $\rightarrow$  goesdo + ne  $\rightarrow$  donego + ne  $\rightarrow$  gone

The matrix and word sum allow us to investigate words like does, done and gone to **understand** the ordered conventions by which English spelling represents the *meaning* structure of words.


Does it make sense for schools to teach children that these are "irregular" words that they just have to memorize?

Although the English writing system is often presented as defective, opaque, or tricky, it is actually a highly ordered, rule-based system that can be studied in a structured, logical way. This "structured word inquiry" approach eliminates rote memorization for spelling and vocabulary study, and reveals aspects of meaning and linguistic structure that teachers often wish they had learned in college.
